Scholarship Policy & Award Framework

Introduction

At our institution, we are committed to recognising academic excellence, leadership potential, professional conduct, and financial need through a range of scholarship opportunities available to eligible students.

Scholarships are intended to support students who demonstrate strong potential to contribute positively to both the academic environment and wider university community. As scholarship funding is limited, all awards are highly competitive and reviewed individually by our Scholarship & Admissions Committee.

Please note that all scholarships are discretionary, non-guaranteed, and subject to availability at the time of application.

Scholarship Assessment Criteria

Scholarship applications are reviewed holistically and may include consideration of the following areas:

1. Academic Merit

Students may be considered for scholarships based on previous academic performance, including but not limited to:

- High school qualifications
- Foundation or pathway grades
- Undergraduate degree results

- Professional certifications
- Predicted grades
- Academic references

Higher academic achievement may result in stronger scholarship consideration.

Examples of Merit Consideration

- Outstanding academic distinction
- Consistent high performance
- Evidence of intellectual curiosity
- Research or extracurricular achievement
- Leadership and initiative

2. Financial Circumstances

Financial support scholarships may be considered for students who can demonstrate genuine financial need.

Students may be asked to provide:

- Household income information
- Supporting financial documentation
- Personal statements
- Employment circumstances
- Regional or economic hardship evidence

Financial need alone does not guarantee scholarship approval and must be considered alongside overall application quality and available funding.

3. Interview Performance & Professional Conduct

All scholarship candidates are expected to demonstrate professionalism, maturity, and alignment with the values of the institution during the admissions and interview process.

The committee may assess:

- Communication skills
- Motivation and ambition
- Commitment to studies

- Professional behaviour
- Engagement during admissions meetings
- Respectful and ethical conduct
- Preparedness and punctuality

Professional conduct throughout the admissions process plays an important role in scholarship consideration.

Scholarship Award Structure

Scholarships may vary in value depending on:

- Academic profile
- Financial need
- Interview performance
- Programme selected
- Campus availability
- Funding allocation for the admissions cycle

Awards may include:

- Partial tuition reductions
- Merit-based tuition support
- Exceptional achievement awards
- Regional or special consideration awards

Scholarship percentages and values are determined individually and are not automatically fixed or standardised.

Important Conditions

Discretionary Awards

All scholarships are awarded entirely at the discretion of the Scholarship & Admissions Committee.

Submission of an application, interview attendance, or meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee a scholarship offer.

The committee reserves the right to:

- Approve or decline applications
- Adjust scholarship amounts
- Request additional documentation
- Withdraw scholarship consideration where necessary
- Close scholarship allocations once capacity is reached

First Come, First Served Basis

Scholarship funding is limited for each admissions cycle.

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis, and awards are generally allocated on a first come, first served basis to qualified candidates.

Students are therefore strongly encouraged to:

- Submit applications early
- Complete documentation promptly
- Attend interviews in a timely manner
- Confirm enrolment quickly where applicable

Delays in application completion may reduce scholarship availability.

Maintaining Scholarship Eligibility

Students awarded scholarships may be expected to:

- Maintain satisfactory academic progress
- Uphold institutional conduct standards
- Meet attendance requirements
- Remain in good financial standing
- Continue to represent the university professionally

Failure to meet institutional expectations may impact future scholarship continuation where applicable.

Final Statement

Our scholarship programme is designed to reward potential, ambition, professionalism, and academic dedication. Due to the competitive and limited nature of available funding, all scholarship decisions remain final and subject to committee discretion.

We encourage all prospective students to apply early and present the strongest possible application across academics, personal motivation, and professional conduct.
